

## EUGENIO MERINO

### *Home Swiss Home*

From may 20th to august 11th 2017

Opening: 20th may at 12h



*It seems that humankind assists in the spectacle of his imagination. It contemplates how the tragic certainty of a birthplace lack can transform spaces into magical lands.*

In a capitalist society, magical places end up being tax havens. Touristic spaces oscillating between a two-day-getaway to disconnect and a peregrination to a holy city. These new destinies offer the tourist a feeling of comfort, exoticism, exclusivity, aspiration and superiority, opposite to the mass that cannot afford the same trip experience and action. This is only available to a few wealthy or lucky ones. Tax havens are configured as theme parks (as the non-places Marc Augé talked about) erected for pleasure. There, tourists delight themselves with a world designed for them and by them, even if they are not fully aware of it.

In this sense, **Eugenio Merino** reproduces a faux souvenir of current tax havens, the axis of the exhibition at **ADN Galeria**: the Bahamas, Luxembourg, Cayman Islands or Switzerland, the latter being the title of the show. Switzerland is, according to Falciani, "the best manager of untaxed money". Merino uses deck chairs embroidered with the flags of these territories to exhibit the close relationship between tax haven and sensory pleasure; to show tax evasion as an orgasmic action, a unique experience.

*Maybe buying a souvenir implies acquiring an object that, up to a certain extent, implies a ritual ceremony. It implies carrying home a fragment of the Other, a side of the Other that, in the end, signifies its totality.*

The souvenir is a sort of personal justification and a symbol of the tourist's social dominance. The trip itself is a colonizer act and the economic transaction maximizes the adjective. Tax havens are generators of economic borders and their clients are soldiers given to the cause. Together they maintain a banking system that stems and perpetuates inequality. Their shield is a practically unbreakable secrecy. Merino points out and reveals issues that revolve around the legislation's inefficiency, its permissiveness and its passivity. His work language, based on irony and popular imagination, serves this purpose.

Merino maintains the premise that one can be in the Bahamas without having to be physically in the place. The touristic experience is enjoyed by money, and in turn the tourist/client enjoys it as an extension of money itself. It's not magic, it is corruption, although there is something inexplicable in its legal consent. The movie *Now You See Me* (2003) shows how a group of illusionists subtract money from the banks while enlivening their shows elsewhere in the world, trying to keep people's attention away from their activity. The parallelism between tax haven and magic land is not far-fetched in the end: making money disappear is a feasible task when its information (as well as the money itself) is fragmented enough so that nobody knows where it is or where it comes from. At the end of the film, the tricks of the illusionists are revealed. Will everything that tax havens hide come to light some day? Falciani opens a door; Merino shows it.

Why do we spend the summers at Marina d'Or, the massive Spanish resort, when you can do it in Switzerland? You will feel at home there. Welcome to Switzerland; welcome home.



## Eugenio Merino (Madrid, España)

Eugenio Merino's works is balanced between beliefs and disbelief, paradox and logics, taste and bad taste, respect and offense. The artist often assumes a cynical role and reveals uncomfortable visions of contemporary societies. His production focuses in the reinterpretation and in the contempt of icons related to politics, art and religion. Across neorealist sculpture, painting, drawings or installations Merino denounce a world based on the rapid item consumed of images and on the media representation. His productions reinterpret and look down on them in a satiric play, with an added sense of acid irony and discursive sarcasm. He finds inspiration in a popular imaginary and mass media which he combines with dialectical, metaphorical and metonymical means to assembly his artworks. The opposition of different realities, as well as disparate referents and symbols, also generate different possible ways of reading his artistic production.

Eugenio Merino has recently exhibited in New York, in Santiago de Chile, at the Station Museum in Texas, the TEA in Tenerife, the Positive Propaganda Art Space in Munich, at the Villa Empain-Fondation Boghossian in Brussels and the Barjola Museum, in Gijón. Merino has participated in several collective exhibitions in the U.S, Spain, Switzerland, Holland, Germany, Belgium, Finland, Mexico and Italy. His artworks could be seen at the B.P.S.22 in Charleroi, the Festival Lens Politica – Film and Media Art Festival, or the MOCA in Taipei, among others.
